




Multiple alignment editor

Jalview Start automatically checks that you are using the most up-to-date version.

If you know that you have Java installed on your system, click Continue.



If you don't have Java version 1.4 or later, just install Java on your machine from from the Java Web Site, then click on the Install link above.

If your browser hasn't been set up to run Java Web Start (NLP files), the Start link above will download the jalview.jar file to your computer. You can then double-click the file instead of automatically downloading it somewhere, or presenting it to you as text). If a dialog box appears with "Open using application..." on it, use the *javaws* application to run your file (and the box marked "Don't ask me again"):

```
<path to java runtime installation>/bin/javaws  
<path to jdk installation>/jre/bin/javaws  
javaws.exe
```

Once you think that your browser should really be working with Java properly, you can test it at [java.com](http://www.jalview.org). If things really are not working, use the InstallAnywhere version of Jalview described below.
